Gaudence Nyirabikali was a parishioner here for about four years whilst a research student at UU Coleraine, and one of her sons attended Dominican College. Gaudence, with her four

children, was a refugee from the Rwandan genocide of 1994. Now that her children have grown up, Gaudence has been working on peace-building initiatives in a number of post-conflict African countries. She is currently involved with the Dominican Order in Bangui, Central African Republic, where the Order is building a new school promoting peace and reconciliation. Gaudence will speak briefly about this work after masses on 26-27 March, and there will be a retiring collection so that we can contribute to this very worthwhile project.

The Pope adds that he thinks especially 'of the elderly, of those who are seeking refuge at this time, of mothers fleeing with their children. They are brothers and sisters for whom it is urgent to open humanitarian corridors and who must be welcomed, with an aching heart, for what is happening in Ukraine.'
