Reconstitution & Forming of Parish Pastoral Councils

In the coming weeks we will be reconstituting our Parish Pastoral Councils in both Portstewart and St. Malachy's, Coleraine and forming a new Parish Pastoral Council in Portrush. This is a significant moment in the life of our parishes as we seek to form and reconstitute the councils. We warmly invite all parishioners to consider stepping into this important role within the parish.

The Importance of Pastoral Councils in the Parishes of Portstewart, Portrush, and Coleraine

Pastoral councils are vital for the effective leadership and guidance of our parishes in St. Malachy's, Coleraine, Portrush and Portstewart. As emphasised by Pope Francis during his pastoral visit to Assisi, these councils are fundamental to fostering collaboration and shared responsibility within our Church community. Since the Second Vatican Council, we have sought ways to embody these values, yet many parish pastoral councils struggle

to maintain their vitality over time due to factors such as unclear purpose and disengagement among members. Recognising these challenges, it is clear that merely improving our meeting structures or record-keeping will not be enough. We need to reimagine our pastoral councils based on a distinctly Catholic model of decision-making that emphasises spiritual discernment over business tactics, drawing from our rich Catholic traditions.

Pope Francis encourages us to embrace a synodal approach, which he describes as the way of being Church in the third millennium. This model promotes active participation from all members of our local communities and fosters a sense of communion and mission. By adopting synodality in St. Malachy's, Coleraine, Portrush and Portstewart we can navigate shared responsibilities, listen to the guidance of the Holy Spirit, and prioritise the voices of the marginalised. A synodal church is characterized by its commitment to the vocation of all baptised individuals, focusing on co-responsibility. It actively listens to the signs of the times and creates safe spaces for dialogue and discernment of the Holy Spirit's guidance.

Selecting the right members for our pastoral councils is crucial to their success. We need individuals who embody a balance of knowledge, compassion, and practical skills—what we can refer to as the "heads, hearts, and hands" approach. There will be those who will provide direction, while passionate individuals will bring empathy and a focus on community concerns. Practical members will help turn ideas into action, ensuring accountability and achievement of our shared goals.

In conclusion, reconstituting and forming pastoral councils through a synodal approach can lead to more vibrant and mission-driven parishes in Portstewart, Portrush, and Coleraine. By embracing collaboration, openness, and a focus on our shared mission, we can effectively navigate contemporary challenges while remaining rooted in our faith and community values. This renewed commitment to co-responsibility and discernment will enable our parishes to thrive in an everevolving world, fostering unity and purpose among all parishioners.
